**ACCIDENT INSURANCE INFORMATION**

A SECONDARY Medical Emergency/Accidental Death or Dismemberment Insurance Policy will be in effect for each person attending Super Summer. This insurance is designed to provide limited coverage in excess of your own medical insurance if it becomes necessary, due to accidents which may occur during your involvement in Super Summer. It will not cover medical expenses arising from ordinary illnesses.

Please bring with you necessary proof of insurance (i.e. an insurance card showing policy number and how to contact your insurance company).

If it becomes necessary for you to file a claim, there will be a \$50 deductible due from the injured party.

**CHECKING IN AT THE CAMPUS:**

- When you arrive at the University, your group should first go to the parking area designated on the campus map sent to your group's Contact Person (usually the person who brings you to Super Summer). Some of our enthusiastic Super Summer staff and University representatives will be there, excited to greet you.
  - All students should walk in the parking lot while only your Church Contact Person goes in to the check-in area.
  - At the check-in area, your Church Contact Person will need to be ready to hand in all Medication Administration/Release Forms and have medications checked by the Super Summer Medical staff. He/She should also have ready any other information which may be needed to complete registration of the group. The Contact Person will be given a Check-In Card for each person in your group, and will then return to the group waiting at the parking lot to distribute the cards. Check-In cards show YOUR SCHOOL and DORM ROOM assignments.
  - When you receive your Check-In card from your Contact Person, go to your school's Welcome Booth. There you will meet your school leaders and get a taste of the excitement of Super Summer. You will receive your NAME TAG, CURRICULUM, SPIRIT SHIRT, CAMPUS MAP, and other information at the Welcome Booth. These items will not be issued without an original Check-In Card, so it is important to wait for your Contact Person to bring it to you! Keep your Check-In Card - You will need it to check in to your dorm room. After your official welcome at your school booth, a Team Leader will help you locate your dorm and assist you with your luggage.
  - At the DORM, you will exchange your Check-In card and a \$10 Bill (which you bring with you) for the key to your dorm room (the \$10 is returned to you at the end of the week when you turn in your key) then you may put your things in your room. You may want to freshen up a little while you are there.
- IMPORTANT: Stay in the room assigned to you. For your own convenience, please do not unpack completely until Tuesday morning because the Super Summer office may have to move you to another room after Monday Check-In is completed. Room changes are made only to help assure that each student has at least one roommate (whenever possible), and changes are authorized ONLY through the Super Summer registration office.*

**IMPORTANT!!**

First meeting after check-in: **3:15 PM - CloudBurst/Orientation**

This is MANDATORY for EVERYONE ATTENDING SUPER SUMMER!!

GROUP PHOTOS of YOU and YOUR SCHOOL will be taken immediately following CloudBurst/Orientation.

First meal served on campus will be Monday dinner, after photos are completed, beginning at 4:45 PM.

## WHAT TO BRING:

- Proof of Medical Insurance (card or other info)
- Bible (with name and address in it)
- Twin Bed Sheets, Blanket and Pillow
- Towels and Washcloths
- Beach towel or small blanket to sit on while outdoors in family groups (optional, but recommended)
- Pen and/or pencils
- Toothbrush, Toothpaste, Comb, Brush, etc.
- Shampoo, Soap, Deodorant
- Sunscreen and Insect Repellent
- Other needed toiletries
- Alarm Clock (NOT a clock/radio and NOT a CELL PHONE)
- \$10 BILL (Key Deposit...MUST BE A \$10 BILL.) Your \$10 will be refunded to you at the end of the week when you return your key.)
- Optional spending money (See info at right to estimate how much you might need).
- Clothes - Casual and conservative clothing, reflective of Christian maturity. NO SLEEVELESS CLOTHING for either boys or girls. MODEST shorts are allowed. Super Summer expects you to abide by the following dress code: (Rule 10) *Casual clothing is acceptable during all activities at Super Summer. Sleeveless shirts, blouses, or dresses will not be allowed for either boys or girls. Shorts and skirts must be no shorter than fingertip length with arms and hands straight down at sides while standing. Low-cut dress necklines, sheer clothing, or clothing that is too revealing (i.e. showing midriff, too tight) are also not allowed. Appropriate shorts are allowed during the evening worship services. Students wearing clothing determined to be too short or too revealing will be asked to change. Repeated disregard for dressing appropriately will be considered a violation of the rules.*

## WHAT NOT TO BRING:

Students at Super Summer are expected to come ready to focus upon God and His Word, leaving the distraction of every day life behind. For this reason, do **not** bring the following items: (Rule 9) *Do NOT bring: CELL PHONES, mp3/CD players/iPods/radios, (including clock radios), televisions, any type of electronic games or equipment, or computers of any kind. Also, any type of duct tape or paint (spray paint, body paint, face paint, etc.) are not allowed. Any of the above names items will be confiscated from the student.* Rule 9 also states: *Drugs, alcohol, any form of tobacco, firearms, knives, or any other kind of weapon, or fireworks are NOT allowed. Any student found in possession of these items will be dismissed from Super Summer and returned home at parent's or student's expense.*

## PACKING INSTRUCTIONS:

- Do NOT pack with anyone else! (You may not end up in the same room.)
- Please mark all your belongings with your name and address. (Don't forget to mark items such as hair dryers, suitcases, pillows and sheets, makeup cases, clothes, etc.)

## HOW MUCH MONEY TO BRING:

Required: \$10 bill for dorm room key deposit  
(Returned to you at the end of the week when you turn in your dorm room key.)

## INFORMATION FOR PARENTS/VISITORS:

*ALL visitors are required to pay a fee of \$10 per person (or \$5 with a Student ID) to receive admission into the worship service. All visitors are required to sit in a visitor section and are asked not to interact with students participating in Super Summer. All visitors must adhere to Super Summer guidelines and rules.*

## SUPER SUMMER EXPECTATIONS AND RULES

**NOTE:** The following is an abbreviated listing of the expectations for those attending Super Summer. For the complete explanation of the rules, please refer to the Super Summer Registration Form.

1. **Students are not allowed off campus.** Students and Team Leaders are not allowed to leave campus, from time of check-in until check-out on Friday.
2. **Late arrivals and/or early check-outs are not permitted. Students must attend ALL scheduled activities and school sessions.** All students will be required to attend all school sessions, family group times, recreation, meals, and Rainbow Celebration worship services, beginning with registration on Monday through the final session on Friday, which concludes at 11:30 AM. There are no exceptions to this unless the participant is injured or sick and are at the medical clinic, or hospital. Being present at each session, discussion time, activity and worship time allows another opportunity to discover how to apply Biblical truths to your own life and in your interactions with other people.
3. **Students are not allowed to ride in or on any vehicle.** While on campus, Super Summer participants will not use cars, busses, vans, motorcycles, skateboards, roller skates or roller blades.
4. **Students must go straight to their meeting room and must leave the building when the class is over.** No loitering.
5. **Anyone who is ill or injured must be either in the Super Summer office, nurse's office, medical clinic or hospital.** In the event of illness or injury, students will not be permitted to remain in their dorm rooms. Students who are ill or injured will be required to rest in the Super Summer nurse's clinic or seek medical assistance in the nurse's office or medical clinic until they are able to return to regularly scheduled activity or session of their school.
6. **Participants must indicate what medications they will use at Super Summer. Medications MUST NOT be shared with anyone else.** All medications each student uses or brings with them to Super Summer are to be listed on the Medication/ Administration Release Form and checked by the Super Summer nurse at check-in time on Monday.
7. **Students and Team Leaders MUST be in the dorms by 11:00 PM. Lights out at 11:30PM.** Adults in Leadership Forum have no curfew, but curfew applies to ALL students and Team Leaders.
8. **Under NO circumstances are girls to be in boys' rooms or boys in girls' rooms.** This also includes hallways outside the dorm rooms. **NO EXCEPTIONS!**
9. **Drugs, alcohol, any form of tobacco, firearms, knives, or any other kind of weapon, or fireworks are NOT allowed.** DO NOT bring any electronic devices, cell phones, or paint. **SEE LEFT SIDE OF THIS BROCHURE - "WHAT TO BRING" FOR A COMPLETE LIST OF WHAT NOT TO BRING WITH YOU.**
10. **Students must dress appropriately. SEE LEFT SIDE OF THIS BROCHURE - "WHAT TO BRING" FOR A COMPLETE LIST OF APPROPRIATE CLOTHING.**
11. **Participants must wear name tags at all times.** The name tag is your ID badge that allows you entrance into campus buildings. Names tags must be worn above the waist to be easily seen.
12. **Refrain from Public Displays of Affection with members of the opposite sex.**
13. **Ordering food to be delivered on campus is forbidden.** You may bring snacks with you to keep in your dorm rooms, but you will still be expected to show up at the cafeteria at meal times. We suggest that any snacks you bring be in re-sealable containers.
14. **Students must obey University rules and regulations.** Be respectful of University faculty, personnel, and students.

**Generally, behavior while at Super Summer should reflect these basic things:**

- Be where you are when you are supposed to be, when you are supposed to be there, doing what you are supposed to be doing.
- Always pray, always be on time, always be flexible.
- Have a good attitude and a teachable spirit.
